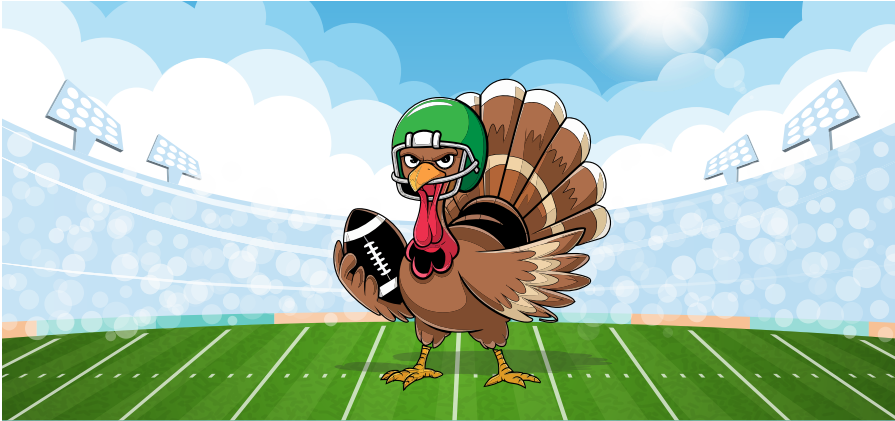

Thanksgiving in Green Bay Touchdowns, turkey and tradition



Thanksgiving in Green Bay has always been about more than turkey and trimmings—it's about tradition, community and the stories that bring people together year after year.

One of the earliest local connections between football and the holiday happened on November 29, 1923, when the Packers hosted a Thanksgiving game at Bellevue Park, shutting out the Hammond Pros 19–0. Home games on Turkey Day have been rare for Green Bay, but that victory remains a proud chapter in the city's sports history.

Fast forward to November 22, 1951, and the Packers once again made Thanksgiving headlines—this time by appearing in their first nationally televised game, played in Detroit against the Lions. For many Wisconsin fans, reception was spotty at best, so families gathered around radios or drove to places with television sets to catch the action. That broadcast helped cement the Packers—and Thanksgiving football—as a shared tradition for generations of fans.

But Thanksgiving in Green Bay isn't just about football—it's about giving back. Since 1983, Christian Outreach's Ecumenical Thanksgiving Dinner has been feeding thousands of neighbors each year. Volunteers prepare and deliver hot meals to those who are alone or in need, making sure no one misses out on the warmth of the holiday. Hi Joel,

Q: My youngest dropped a sticky piece of hard candy into the carpeting and I didn't notice it for a few days. Is there a way to remove it from the carpeting?

A: *The best way I've found is to gently scrape off as much as you can from the fibers with a spoon or a dull knife. Then, with hot water and a couple of drops of dish detergent pre-mixed, use a clean white rag to dab the area with the solution. Work it in gently with your hands. If you scrub too hard you may damage the fibers permanently, so please be careful. Repeat this process as needed. To avoid over-wetting, dab the area with a dry rag between applications. Repeat until removed. Rinse with fresh water on a clean white rag and use another dry rag to dab the spot dry.*

Joel says:

Remember, spots and stains can be tricky, and certain cleaners and techniques can cause permanent damage.

Healthy Pet Talk



Four Common Pet Myths

With so much information available on pet care, it's easy to become confused about what's really best for them. To cut through some of the clutter, Dr. Ashley Gallagher, veterinarian and petMD contributor, sheds some light on some of the most common pet myths.

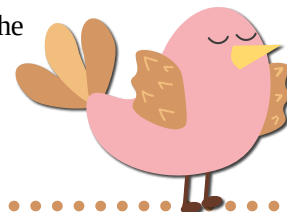
- ▶ **Myth 1:** Cats have nine lives. Cats' curious nature and quick reaction times are likely the basis of the nine lives reputation, but in reality, owners need to remember that both cats and dogs only have one life. That is why it's important to schedule regular veterinary visits to ensure your pet has a long, healthy and happy one.
- ▶ **Myth 2:** Table scraps are OK. Table scraps are basically empty calories for cats and dogs. They need precisely-balanced nutrition for their specific life stage and special needs to remain healthy. An ounce of cheddar cheese for a 20-pound dog is like a human eating one and a half chocolate bars.
- ▶ **Myth 3:** Dogs wag their tail when they are happy. Dogs wag their tail for many reasons; the most common is that they are either happy or nervous. Cats will also wag or flick their tail when they are upset or thinking. Pets communicate via complex body language -- learning to accurately read what your pet is telling you will go a long way in helping to build a fulfilling relationship.
- ▶ **Myth 4:** Letting my dog out in the yard is enough exercise. Dogs and cats both need plenty of physical activity and mental stimulation to stay healthy. If you just leave your dog out in the yard alone they might not get much of either. It's important to take them for walks, play fetch or simply run around together. Not only will it make for a happier, healthier dog, but it will also help to strengthen your relationship. Cats should be kept indoors for their safety, but there are plenty of toys that work their brains and their bodies at the same time.

Birds and power lines

Unlike humans, most perching birds (with one notable exception) can touch power lines. The reason is that birds are not in contact with any part of the ground.

Humans can never touch a power line because the electricity will travel from the line to the ground they are standing on, electrocuting them in the process.

What is the bird that can almost never touch power lines? The huge California Condor with a wing span of nine feet nearly always is electrocuted by power lines. Its wings span two lines creating a short circuit or it can touch the pole and line at the same time, allowing electricity to travel to the ground.

The wreck of the Edmund Fitzgerald: remembering 50 years



November in Wisconsin and the Great Lakes region always carries a certain chill—partly from the weather, and partly from the memory of one of Lake Superior’s most haunting tragedies. This year marks the 50th anniversary of the wreck of the Edmund Fitzgerald, the largest ship ever lost on the Great Lakes.

On November 10, 1975, the Fitzgerald—a massive iron ore freighter at 729 feet long—was making its way from Superior, Wisconsin, to a steel mill in Detroit. The ship, loaded with 26,000 tons of taconite pellets, encountered a fierce November gale with winds over 60 miles per hour and waves reported at more than 25 feet.

Captain Ernest McSorley and his 28 crewmen fought the storm for hours, but shortly after 7 p.m., the Fitzgerald suddenly disappeared from radar. No distress call was ever sent. All 29 men aboard perished. The exact cause remains a mystery, though theories include structural failure, flooding, or being swamped by an enormous rogue wave.

The wreck was discovered later that month in 530 feet of water near Whitefish Bay, Michigan. In the decades since, the story of the Fitzgerald has become part of Great Lakes lore, remembered in song, books and countless memorials. The ship’s bell was recovered in 1995 and now rests at the Great Lakes Shipwreck Museum at Whitefish Point.

This November, communities across the region will pause to honor the 29 souls lost. The wreck of the Edmund Fitzgerald is more than a tale of tragedy—it’s a reminder of the power of nature, the bravery of sailors and the enduring spirit of the Great Lakes.

TRIBUTE AT MARINERS’ CHURCH (DETROIT)

On May 2, 2023, the day after Gordon Lightfoot’s death, Mariners’ Church (often referred to in Lightfoot’s song as the “Maritime Sailors’ Cathedral” in Detroit) rang its bell 30 times:

- ▶ 29 chimes in memory of the 29 crewmen lost in the Edmund Fitzgerald tragedy
- ▶ 1 additional chime in honor of Gordon Lightfoot himself

The church has long held memorial ceremonies for the Edmund Fitzgerald. In the years following the ship’s sinking in 1975, the bell would toll 29 times (once for each lost sailor) as part of annual remembrance traditions.
